Subjects: migration / technology

Age group: 13-15

Time: 45 to 90 minutes / depending on the students cooperation

Brief Description: Teach approach migration and technology.

After the lesson the students will be able to:

- get to know the definition of migration;
- look for pros and cons of using technology;
- learn to look up the crucial information;
- talk about the immigration impact of technology use;
- work in groups and cooperate.

Materials needed:

- white sheets of paper
- Internet connection, computer
- a short footage:

- 1. Teacher explains the definition of migration.
- 2. Students watch the footage presenting by Assistant Professor, University of Minnesota Department of Computer Science and Engineering.

"When children are separated from their parents -- whether due to migration, custody changes, incarceration or any number of other factors -- how can families maintain connection? Computer scientist Lana Yarosh showcases why it's important to design technology that empowers people to share meaningful interactions beyond a video chat or phone call, granting them the chance to reconnect despite life's big disruptions."

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3. After watching, students and a teacher talk about pros and cons of using technology.

4. During the second part, one of the student is a moderator of a discussion (ask questions and keep the conversation going) between two groups whereas one is **for** and the other group is **against** the idea:
