“English in Modern Times of Fluid Change”

Topic: Right to freedom and tolerance

Subjects: freedom/ tolerance/ multicultural society/ social studies

Age group: 13-15

Time: 45 minutes

Brief Description: Teach approach to tolerant society.

After the lesson the students will be able to:

- give the definition of tolerance;
- give the definition of freedom;
- learn to look up the crucial information;
- collaborate to achieve a certain goal;
- develop their language skills;
- develop their social skills;
- work in groups and cooperate.

Materials needed:

- white sheets of paper
- colourful markers, crayons or pens

1. The teacher starts the lesson with the sentence - “People have the right to be different. Living together without tolerance is impossible” and asks students what do they think about it.

2. After a short discussion/ exchanging students’ ideas the teacher asks a question:

What is tolerance?

He/ she divides the students into smaller groups and asks them to make an association map. The students have about 10 minutes to complete the task. When the time is out each group presents their ideas.

3. Students work in the same groups and are asked to find the answers to the following questions:

- What are examples of tolerance/ intolerance?
- Why is tolerance important?
- How can we show tolerance to others?
- How does tolerance appear in society?

4. The last task is to prepare a common poster - We are different = We are equal.

- Work together and try to prepare one poster.
- You can use different methods:
 - you can draw something,
 - you can print photos,
 - you can use slogans,
 - write your own ideas,
 - you can use the Internet to look for information .
- Remember about the topic of the poster.

5. When you are ready present the poster to your teacher.

6. As an evaluation the common poster will be presented on school's notice board and school's social media.

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
